Welcome to the 24th Annual Scott Roche Water Polo Invitational at Menlo School and Menlo-Atherton High.

The tournament is in memory of Scott Roche, a Menlo School '90 and Princeton University '94 graduate and water polo standout. As a senior captain, Roche guided Menlo to a league championship. At Princeton, he captained the Tigers to a 26-1 record, Ivy League title and a No. 7 national ranking. After graduating, Scott remained an ardent supporter of both the Menlo and Princeton water polo teams. He died in a car accident in Seattle in 1998 just days before his 25th birthday. Scott was inducted into the Menlo School Athletics Hall of Fame in 2015.

The tournament features a field of 16 of the top teams in the state, and continues to be one of the most prestigious events in Northern California. This tournament guarantees each team four games over two days. The third-place match will be held Saturday, Sept. 10 at 3:40 p.m., and the championship will be held at 4:45 pm in the Menlo School pool.
